Foundations of American Literary Tradition

William Bradford's 'Of Plimoth Plantation,' 1630-1651

Pr. Walter L. Powell will be the Guest Speaker for our Spring Dinner. He will speak about William Bradford's journal, 'Of Plimoth Plantation,' which is an eyewitness account of the Pilgrims' early years, 1630-1651.

A native of Connecticut, Dr. Powell is the first Executive Director of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants. He is a well-known public Historian who specializes in American Colonial and Civil War studies. He earned a Master's degree in American History and a Ph.D. in American Literature from Kent State University. His dissertation focused on Edward Taylor, America's foremost Colonial poet, who was also a pastor and physician in a 17th-century frontier community.

Dr. Powell has lectured widely on a variety of topics in American history, literature, and music. He is an expert on 17th and 18th century New England, French and Indian War, Civil War, and World War II. Prior to his position at GSMD, Dr. Powell was Director of Planning and Historic Preservation in Gettysburg, where he supervised the restoration of the Gettysburg Railroad Station (circa 1858). He was also project Historian for

the David Wills House renovation, where President Abraham Lincoln delivered his famous Gettysburg address.

Dr. Powell also served as interim Director of the George Tyler Moore Center for the Study of the Civil War at Shepherd University in Shepherdstown, WV; Executive Director of the Conococheague Institute for the Study of Cultural Heritage in Mercersburg, PA; and an Adjunct Professor in the graduate program in Applied History at Shippensburg University.

As author and editor of a number of books and articles, Dr. Powell currently serves on the Board of Plymouth 400 and as Chairman of the Plymouth Historical Alliance. Dr. Powell and his wife, Susan, live in North Plymouth. We look forward to this informative presentation.

Costumes for the 400th Celebration!

As the 400th anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrims nears, we should consider dressing the part! Our Society is fortunate to have our own historic costumer, Susan Scott Battles Brown. Susan, who made the costumes shown in the

Chilton's Challenge DVD, has graciously agreed to make costumes for our members. Susan will be attending the Spring Dinner and will assist in costume selection.

Collaboration: There will be a collaborative effort to consider the ancestor's occupation, age, time period and other details. For example, James Chilton's costume was a little fancier because he was a well-dressed tailor who wanted to advertise his wears. Mary Chilton would have worn fancier clothing also, as she was a grandmother and one of the wealthiest people in Boston in 1670. Susan will make costumes from scratch to fit your measurements.

Time: Consultations will begin before Dinner on Sunday, April 26, from 10-12, and after Dinner, around 4 p.m.

Cost: The cost for a basic, custom-made costume is approximately \$100.00 for labor and \$100.00 for material (depending on fabric selection), for a total of \$200.00. Please note that material costs vary depending on selection of trim, buttons, and other details.

Considering one-quarter of the U.S. population is roughly 70 million, this figure is twice the estimated number of Mayflower descendants worldwide. However, only about 25,000 members are able to document their ancestry to meet research requirements.

How can we get more Mayflower descendants to join our Society? The best place to start is with our own families, including siblings, children, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews and cousins. Because of their relationship to YOU, these individuals are a KNOWN Mayflower Descendant whose lineage is relatively easy to document. Treasurer's Corner

Since being installed as the Society's new Treasurer at the Compact Day Dinner, the past several months have been a learning experience. Below is a status report:

- **Membership Dues:** As of March 15, we have collected dues from 201 members, including junior members. Two members and seven junior members have become life members. A special thanks to Ben Proctor, who paid for junior life memberships for his seven grandchildren!
- **Revenue:** To date, we received \$8,600 annual membership and \$6,500 in lifetime membership dues. Other revenue include *Chilton's Challenge* DVDs, gifts, and other fees.
- **Expenditures:** Expenses include the annual assessment paid to GSMD of \$6,759 and other smaller operating fees.
- **Assets & Liabilities:** The balance in our checking account is \$6,759.86 and in our investment account, \$64,468.31.

COMPACT DAY DINNER: Exploring Early Maryland

On Sunday, November 23, 2014, members and guests met at the L'Hirondelle Club in Ruxton, Maryland for our annual Compact Day Dinner. Governor Ben Proctor introduced our Guest Speaker, Dr. Henry Miller, the Heritage Scholar at the Maryland State Museum of Historic St. Mary's City. Dr. Miller compared various aspects of the early Maryland residents to that of the Massachusetts settlers.

Dr. Miller gave an enlightening and historical presentation, which included a slide show and archaeological research. Dr. Miller noted that both colonies came for freedom and opportunity. However, their beginnings were difficult. He spoke of the influences that affected the daily lives of Maryland settlers such as food, architecture, ceramics, life expectancy, commerce, and crops.



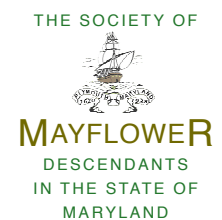
